Impact of Pupil Premium Funding at Aslacton Primary School 2019-20

Please note due to the Coronavirus the school closed between March and May 2020. Reopening in June in line with DfE guidance.

- Pupil Premium children experienced playing a musical instrument and the opportunity to enjoy musical activities (including hand bells), and learnt to have confidence in playing and performing in front of others.
- Parent Liaison Officer- had contact with Pupil Premium families as a result the children were safer, happy and free from harm.
- Educational visits provided new Social and Cultural experiences.
- Pupil premium children have made rapid progress in writing and reading due to individualised input tailored to their specific needs (handwriting, spelling, writing, speech (interventions)).
- Thrive activities supported Pupil Premium children in developing their confidence and self-esteem resulting in improved engagement with their learning.
- Attendance monitoring removed barriers to improve attendance by offering a Breakfast club.
- Head of School focus group 'Aslacton Express' –improved the development of Key Stage 2 writing and publishing skills.
- CPOMS a digital platform recording pupil details enabled effective communication between school practitioners and other agencies to meet the needs of Pupil Premium children.
