The Spring Term at Aslacton has been full and busy with lots of new core stories, learning cafés, parent project sessions, the return of Forest Schools and new clubs. Kestrel class have completed their swimming programme and have all been awarded their certificates. Due to the polite, hardworking attitudes of our children we have been offered the extra term of swimming we had this year again next year, so we hope to be taking Eagles in the Autumn term again. Well done to everyone who has represented our school at the pool, we are very proud of the way you have behaved and learned whilst you have been there.

Since half term the remodelling work has started on the kitchen at Manor Field and we are hopeful about a completion date a few weeks after we come back from the Easter break. Trevor, Steve and their team have worked with us and apart from staff parking spaces, there has been very little disruption to date. The completion of the new permanent kitchen will enable us to have more reliable kitchen facilities and will remove the problems we had before Christmas with frozen pipes etc. Please check the website for the new menu which begins after the Easter break.

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## **Around the School**

Owls have enjoyed our core story "The Last Wolf" this half term. We have found out about lots of traditional tales where wolves play a part as well as learning about the life-cycle and habitats of real life wolves around the world. We have written advice to the main characters and made wanted posters as part of our English. We have also learned about different landscape features ending in a project to create a landscape where our core story characters could live. In art we have been exploring painting and colour mixing, and were able to demonstrate our skills to our grown ups at our parent project session. In computing we have explored a new app -Scratch Jnr—where we have learned to code different characters called sprites. The children have really loved using this new technology and have made really good progress with it. Well done Owls—have a lovely Easter.

In **Kestrel** Class, we have had a busy final week of Spring term. We have finished off our topic learning about significant historical explorers: Christopher Columbus, Ibn Battuta, Amelia Earhart and Neil Armstrong. In our art lessons, we have practised developing our sketching skills by focusing on facial features, and applying these skills by completing self-portraits in the style of Quentin Blake. We have all really enjoyed reading our core story, The Green Ship, and have created story maps to help us verbally retell what happens. Our story has inspired our writing and we have completed brilliant diary entries, character descriptions and poetry. We have developed our performance skills by using our voices and bodies to perform our poems to one another. In our science lessons we have explored how we can stay healthy by looking at different food groups and healthy diets. In PE, we have worked hard on teamwork while playing tag rugby. A big well done to those in Years 3 and 4 who have been swimming this term; super progress has been made by all! Have a wonderful Easter everyone!

**Eagle** Class have thoroughly enjoyed reading both Harry Potter and Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. It has been brilliant to observe these texts encouraging imagination, fantasy and description. The children have written a range of genres this term from potion recipes to ghost stories! In Maths, we have worked hard to master fractions, decimals and percentages. We have improved our multiplication fluency and deepened our understanding of problem solving using a range of reasoning questions. In Science and Geography, we have enjoyed studying Evolution and the Galapagos Islands. An interesting topic and we clearly have lots of budding Marine Biologists! In Art, we have created and described our own mythical creatures, taking inspiration from our core-stories and film studies. A special mention to Year 6 for their effort and concentration in SATs practise and workshops. A hard-working term. Well done, Eagles.
