Reading

In books which are familiar or of an age appropriate level:

- Find repeated words and phrases
- Know the difference between fiction and non-fiction
- Recognise and join in with repeated phrases
- Relate reading to own experiences
- Re-read if reading does not make sense
- Re-tell a familiar story
- Find the title
- Predict what might happen
- Answer how or why questions
- Read aloud with pace and expression, i.e. pause at full stop; raise voice for question.
- Recognise and talk about the reasons for the author using:
 - o capital letters
 - full stops
 - o question marks
 - o exclamation marks
 - o ellipsis

Writing

- Write sentences which make sense
- Use 'and' to join ideas
- Use conjunctions to join sentences (e.g. so, but).
- Begin to use past and present tense correctly (go/ went)
- Introduce use of:
 - o capital letters
 - o full stops
 - o question marks
 - o exclamation marks
- Use capital letters for names and personal pronoun 'l'.
- Write a sequence of sentences to form a short piece of writing, either fiction or non-fiction.
- Use correct letter formation of lower case letters, starting and ending in the correct place
- Use correct formation of capital letters
- Use correct formation of numbers





Mathematics

- Count to and across 100, forwards & backwards from any number
- Read and write numbers to 20 in numerals & words
- Read and write numbers to 100 in numerals
- Say 1 more/1 less than any number up to 100
- Count in multiples of 2, 5 & 10
- Begin to know number bonds and subtraction facts to 20
- Add & subtract:
 - o 1 digit & 2 digit numbers to 20, including zero.
- Solve one-step multiplication and division using objects, and pictures
- Recognise half and quarter of object, shape or quantity
- Sequence events in time order
- Use language of day, week, month and year
- Tell time to hour & half past
- Compare, measure and start to note down length, mass and capacity
