### We will be learning:

- Continue with multiplication and division (Y2)
- Compare and measure heights and lengths and begin to use centimeters (Y1) and metres (Y2)
- Calculate heights and lengths by adding, subtracting and multiplying cm and m (Y2)
- Measure and compare weight and capacity (Y1) and use grams, kilograms, millilitres and litres (Y2)
- Measure and compare temperatures (Y2)
