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VE DAY Thursday 8th May



This year marks the 80th anniversary of the end of the Second World War in Europe on 8th May 1945 and the end of the War in Japan on 15th August 1945 (VJ Day). There will be lots of national celebrations and commemorations during the week starting 5th May for VE Day and in school we will be marking this on Thursday 8th May.

We are inviting children to attend in 1940s style clothing or red, white and blue. Costumes do not need to be elaborate or bought especially—have a look in your wardrobe and see what you can find that is close to the style—some information about typical clothing of the period can be found below

In the run up we will be learning a song that is being released for the commemoration and a 1940s VE Day dance. On the day we will gather to sing and dance together as a school and we will spend time during the day using resources that have been put together by the Royal British Legion to help young people to remember VE and VJ Day 80 years on, with special films including stories from the end of the Second World War. There will also be a special lunch that day—details to follow after Easter.

1940's Children's Clothing Ideas:

Young boys wore shorts or trousers with a blazer or jacket for more formal occasions or sweaters for casual wear.

Girls primarily wore cotton dresses and skirts with blouses or shirts and a cardigan or jumper. Very young girls sometimes wore overalls.

Hand-knitted garments like sweaters and cardigans were easy and popular items for young children.

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This half term's highlights

What a busy term it has been in Owl Class. The children have enjoyed exploring Hermelin by Mini Grey and Where the Wild Things Are by Maurice Sendak . We have been particularly concentrating on sentence structure and letter formation. We are impressed with the pride the children are taking in the presentation of their writing. Reception have enjoyed exploring 'Little Red ' by Bethan Woolvin. They enjoyed writing instructions on How to trap a wolf! Our Science focus has been looking at Seasonal change, planting and caring for our planet. KS1 enjoyed learning about the Great Fire of London and how the fire spread so quickly. Reception children have focussed on using their phonic skills to support them with their reading and writing. Everyone enjoyed discussing VIP's in PSHE. Well done Owls on all your hard work and on helping each other this term.

Kestrels have explored the fascinating world of soil, fossils, and light in science and. sacrifice, looking at its significance in both Christianity and Islam in RE. In Geography, we discovered the unique landscape of Tierra del Fuego, investigating its weather and location and comparing it to our own local area. Design and Technology saw us get creative with designing, making, and evaluating our very own book covers. In English, we enjoyed reading Jemmy Button and retelling the story in our own words.

Eagles have enjoyed reading classic Sherlock Holmes and 'The Promise'. We have written a range of stories, poems and letters with growing maturity and skill. We have loved geometry mathematics, and we have enjoyed studying lines and angles. In history, we have discovered the impact Ancient Greece has had on the modern day. In science, we have explored material properties and the importance of a healthy lifestyle. A fantastic term!
