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

Vaccinations On **Friday 8th November** we have the vaccination team in school to administer the nasal flu vaccine to those who have responded to say they wish their child to be vaccinated.

Below is a link to a video from NHS Scotland that shows what will happen on the day. We would encourage you to share this with your child during half term and talk to them about what is going to happen so that they are not anxious or frightened by the process. School staff will sit with a child if they want them to, but are always in the room and on hand to encourage and support them. If a child refuses to let the nurse administer the spray then you will be contacted to arrange an alternative appointment for them.

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Attendance

There is room for improvement to be made with pupil attendance at school. It is a legal requirement that your child attends school everyday unless they are genuinely unwell. IF YOUR CHILD IS ABSENT FROM SCHOOL FOR ANY REASON, YOU MUST INFORM THE SCHOOL ON EACH DAY OF ABSENCE before 9.00am. In most cases there are very simple explanations for absence, but if you do not tell us, your child's absence has to be recorded as unauthorised.
